Ensembles

With nearly 200 students in six different choirs plus SCAPA Voice, there are a lot of things going on and lots to keep track of. Knowing which choir you are in will simplify things significantly. Ensembles are usually set in the Spring and changes will usually not be made after classes begin.

Men's and Women's Chorus – These choruses are designed primarily for beginning and intermediate choral instruction. They will provide an understanding of the fundamentals of proper vocal techniques, choral techniques, and music theory (as it applies to selected pieces.) Special attention will be given to individual vocal development through small ensembles and solo work. Students also will be prepared for future membership in Lafayette's advanced choirs. These choirs do not require an audition for enrollment.

The **Men's choir** is directed by Mr. Marsh. Highlights of the year include UK Male Chorus Day, concerts throughout the year, contest and performing at LHS athletic events.

The **Women's Choir** is directed by Ms. Gabbard and assisted by Mr. Marsh. Highlights of the year include KMEA Festival Contest. The Women's Choir Festival in February, Bluegrass Choral Music Festival and concerts throughout the year.

Lafayette Singers – The Lafayette Singers tradition exemplifies the quality of the outstanding choral music that has become a part of the history of Lafayette Senior High School. "Singers" is a performance-oriented class geared to expose students to a wide variety of choral literature, ranging from the various historical styles through rehearsal and performance. Students will be given the opportunity to learn proper vocal/choral techniques, breathing skills, sight-reading skills, and basic musicianship (theory and history). Performances will take place throughout the school year and students will be given opportunities to participate individually, as well as in the choral ensemble. Singers is open to students by audition.

Lafayette Chorale – The Lafayette Chorale serves as the advanced vocal ensemble of the Choral department at Lafayette. Chorale is a performance-oriented class geared to expose students to the highest quality and variety in choral literature, ranging from the various historical styles through rehearsal and performance. Students will be given the opportunity to learn proper vocal/choral techniques, breathing skills, sight-reading skills, and basic musicianship (theory and history). Performances will take place throughout the school year and students will be given opportunities to participate individually, as well as in the choral ensemble. Chorale is open to students by audition only. Chorale is a weighted grade course. With this comes the added expectation of ALWAYS rehearsing at an exceptional level and working hard each and every day.

Madrigal Singers – This is a chamber ensemble, which is open to advanced vocal students (usually grades 11&12). Students in this ensemble will study and perform music from virtually all stylistic and historic periods and they will learn advanced vocal/choral techniques, sight-reading and basic musicianship (theory and history).

Swing Choir – This is an ensemble of about 15 vocal music students who explore the vocal jazz style. Various repertoires is studied and performed from the great jazz standards of the jazz eras. Ear training, improvisation, and advanced harmonies are emphasized in this vocal group.

SCAPA Voice – Vocal majors are enrolled in either Singers or Chorale for scheduling purposes. If you are an incoming freshmen, you will be in Singers. SCAPA majors participate in the Choir Gala, private lessons, recitals, and solo and ensemble, in addition to all of the activities of the choir you are enrolled in.

How to Move Up in the Choirs: Each choir is a preparation for entrance into the next chorus level. Our goal is to prepare each student for successful advancement in the choirs. Auditions are held in the Spring for the following school year. Each student singing in a choir is required to audition as part of the participation grade for that semester. <u>Mastering Musicianship Lessons (M2)</u>: This is a great opportunity for students to take private voice lessons after school for a reduced rate. The cost to students is \$100 for 10 lessons during a semester. Look for more information on this program. Registration is in the Fall.

<u>UK Bluegrass Choral Music Festival</u>: This is an extra singing opportunity open to all LHS Choir students and is sponsored by the University of Kentucky Choral Department held at the UK Singletary Ctr. Nearly 500 Singers from across the state join for two days of rehearsal and a performance. Sign up in August for the event on **September 21 and 22**.

Gala and Silent Auction: This is the opening concert event for the concert season! All are welcome. Performers include: Singers, Chorale, Madrigals, Swing Choirs and SCAPA Vocal Majors.

Fall Concert: The Men's and Women's choirs perform in concert.

<u>Winter Concerts</u>: The Swing Choir, and Men and Women's Choirs perform their winter concert in Beeler auditorium on Lafayette's Campus. Singers, Madrigals and Chorale hold their concert at an area church or Singletary center.

Lafavette Choral Invitational: This event takes place in January. 7th and 8th grades from Lafayette's feeder schools are invited to work with the choirs at Lafayette. All Lafayette Choir Students are required to attend.

Women's Choir Festival: This Festival is a new event for the 07-08 school year. The LHS Women's Choir will join with several other schools in the Central Kentucky Area for a festival concert in February. This promises to be a fun day of singing and performing.

<u>UK Male Chorus Day</u>: This is open to all Men in the LHS Choirs. (It is required for the LHS Men's Choir). It takes place in January at the UK Singletary Center.

Solo and Ensemble Contest: This contest is held at Scott County High School (in Late February or March) for soloists and small ensembles. These are usually prepared with Ms. Gabbard or Mr. Marsh outside of the school day. The student sings their solo or ensemble piece for an adjudicator. Sign-ups are in early January.

KMEA Festival Assessment: All choirs perform at Festival Assessment in March for comments and rating.

<u>Spring Chorus Banquet</u>: Celebrate the successes of the year at our annual choral banquet in early May.

Ice-Cream Concert: All choirs will perform at the Ice-Cream concert in the spring.

** Important Parent Meeting ** -- <u>Tuesday</u>, August 21st at 7:00 pm

There will be a parent meeting on Aug 21 in the Choir Room for all choir parents. We will cover concert attire, fundraising, and other important items for the year. There will also be an opportunity to meet and talk with our Directors, Mr. Marsh and Ms. Gabbard as well as members from the Chorus Booster Association. <u>Please make plans to attend.</u>

CONCERT ATTIRE

Attire for Women's and Men's Chorus varies for each concert. Sometimes this will include the Chorus T-shirt that is issued at the beginning of the school year and jeans, other times it will be more formal attire. Usually black pants or skirt, colored shirt or blouse, or white top. Students are responsible for providing this attire.



Tuxedos & formal black dresses are provided only for students enrolled in Madrigals, Singers, and Chorale.

Fees:

Chorus fees are an unfortunate necessity. They are, however, extremely inexpensive when compared to the cost associated with most other school-related extra-curricular activity your student might choose. Fees include: choir T-shirt (used for performances), folder, music, pencil, transportation, participation fees in area-wide contests and festivals, etc.

Beginning Choir Fees • \$50/year (Women's, Men's Choir) (Option to pay in two \$25 semester payments)

Advanced Choir Fees • \$80/year (Singers, Chorale, Madrigals, Swing) (Option to pay in two \$40 semester payments)

(One could not purchase a choir tuxedo or dress for the cost of the annual chorus fees!)

Ryan Marsh is a native of Floyd Knobs, Indiana. Ryan attended the University of Louisville School of Music from 1997 to 2003 where he earned the Bachelor of Music Education degree in Choral Music, Piano and Voice, and the Master of Music Performance Degree in Choral Conducting.

Ryan has an interest international choral music and has attended and sung in international choral competitions. He is active as an adjudicator for Kentucky Music Educators Association (KMEA) contests and festivals. Ryan is a staff member of the Kentucky Ambassadors of Music European program and represents the Central

Kentucky Region. He is also the Lexington District All-State Chorus Co-Chair and KMEA State Choral Chair-Elect.

Mr. Marsh is proud to direct the Lafayette Chorale, Singers, Madrigals, and Men's Chorus. He is assistant director for the Lafayette Women's Choir. He also teaches AP Music Theory. He is married to Tiffany who is the choral director at Western Hills High School in Frankfort. They live in Midway.



Laura Gabbard is a native of Mt. Sterling, KY where she graduated from <u>Montgomery County High School</u>. She credits her involvement in the music programs of the Montgomery County Public Schools with the beginnings of her musical passion and ultimately, her career.

Ms. Gabbard is a graduate of <u>Morehead State University</u> where she completed both her undergraduate and graduate degrees. As an undergraduate, she received her Bachelor of Music Education degree as a piano major on the choral/vocal education track of study. She also received the Master of Music degree while studying music

education and choral conducting. Ms. Gabbard recently completed Level II training in the Kodaly philosophy of music literacy and education. She began her teaching career in 2002 at Southern Middle School in Fayette County where she was responsible for general music classes, grades 6-8, as well as the 6th, 7th and 8th grade choirs. She has also had a private piano and voice studio since 1996. For many years, Ms. Gabbard has served as an accompanist for various choirs, soloists (both vocal and instrumental), and musical productions. She also serves as a church musician both as a pianist as well as a vocalist.

Fundraising 2007-2008 Details

FUNDRAISING

Fundraising is a necessary part of any school music organization. Operating expenses for groups such as ours far exceed the dollars supplied by FCPS to the choral program. In order for the department to remain vital and offering quality experiences to our students, fundraiser participation is a necessity for each student. Money raised though fund-raising and fees are used for many purposes (seen and unseen) over the course of a school year. (See Newsletter Pg. 4)

The Choral Department and Boosters work hard to <u>keep student fees low</u> and offset those low fees with fundraising efforts. Please keep in mind all of the often "unseen, behind the scenes" expenses when considering your level of commitment to fundraising. Your help is a necessity to continue this outstanding program, therefore, <u>EACH STUDENT IS ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE VARIOUS</u> FUNDRAISERS THAT THE CHORAL DEPARTMENT SPONSORS EACH YEAR or give an Inlieu-of Donation.

IN-LIEU-OF or OPT-OUT CONTRIBUTIONS

This year, the booster board will again offer an "In-lieu-of" fundraising possibility for those who may be overburdened with several organizations to fund raise for or for those who would simply prefer not to sell items. The "In-lieu-of" program is intended to allow folks to still contribute to the organization allowing us to meet our fund-raising goals, but perhaps avoid selling items.

If this sounds like the right choice for you, Lafayette Chorus Boosters are suggesting a yearly In-lieu-of contribution of \$75 (\$25 for each major sales fundraiser). This in-lieu-of takes the place of your student participating in three major fund-raising initiatives for the choir. These three sales include: <u>Cookie Dough</u>, <u>Coupon Books</u>, and <u>Candy Sales</u>. Those taking part in the In-Lieu-Of program will not qualify for fundraising credits. In-lieu-of Donations to the Lafayette Booster organization are Tax-Deductible.

This year's planned fundraisers include the following:

Sponsorship and Patron Program ads. (September '07) Gala and Silent Auction (October '07) *Cookie Dough (Fall '07) *Raffle (Fall '07) *Candy Sales (January '08) *indicates fundraisers that are included in the "in-lieu-of" donation program.

FUNDRAISING CREDITS

For most sales fundraisers we try to offer student account credits. Credits are offered as incentives for students to sell and give opportunities for students to pay for activities they are involved in. Credits are applied to student accounts and can be carried over from one year to the next (in saving for a choir trip) or can be applied to <u>banquet costs</u>, <u>trips</u>, or <u>other activities</u> which involve costs to students. Student credit details are announced at the onset of each fundraiser. Credits **will not** be cashed out to students. Any unused credits at the end of a student's senior year will be rolled into the booster general fund.

LAFAYETTE CHORUS BOOSTER ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP

All vocal music families are invited and encouraged to join the Lafayette Chorus Booster Association whose work is to support the Lafayette Choral Department, its Directors, and the Vocal Music students. Membership entitles you to be a voting member of the organization and is only \$10.00 per year per family.
