

GSA's primary components include a three-week summer residency program utilizing distinguished professional and teaching artists, students are immersed in a rigorous curriculum and supportive learning environment that allows them to explore the discipline and freedom of the creative process.

The purpose of these FREE Artshops is to provide high school freshmen, sophomores and juniors with the opportunity to spend a day in a facility close to their hometown in a hands-on arts enrichment opportunity to participate in a masterclass in their artform led by a GSA faculty member or guest artist. Students also learn about the GSA summer program, audition and application procedures, as well as other arts opportunities in their area.

The Kentucky Center Governor's School for the Arts is holding free, one-day ArtShops throughout Kentucky this fall, and it's the perfect chance to experience what GSA is all about. Students choose an art form to specialize in from GSA's core offerings of architecture, creative writing, dance, drama, instrumental music, musical theatre, new media, visual art and vocal music.

This past weekend the following freshmen participated in KYACDA All-State Honor Choir.

Outstanding All-State Auditions:

Some info about the auditions: Lexington District has 2 sub districts including schools from Fayette, Scott, Harrison, Clark, Franklin, Bourbon, Woodford, and Jessamine counties. District 7 is tied w/ Jefferson County as the largest district in the state. (226 students auditioned in total). LHS had 27 auditionees.

- We had the top 7 scores in our sub-district 7B (all voice parts combined)
- We had 7 of the top 10 scores in the entire district 7 A&B combined.
- Lafayette had the top 4 Alto <u>quartet</u> scores in 7B.
- Lafayette had the top 6 Alto total scores (quartet and s/r combined) in 7B
- Bonnie Stuck (senior) had the highest Alto quartet score in 7B.
- Elliott Mattox (sophomore) had the highest Tenor <u>total</u> score in 7B.
- Katie Sink (senior) had the highest Alto total score in 7B.
- Ryan Story (junior) had the highest Bass total score in 7B.
- Sarah Tubbesing (senior) had the highest Soprano total score in 7B.

And this is my Favorite!!!! ----

- Lafayette had 9 perfect scores of 10 on sight-singing.
- 5 9.9's on sight-singing. And 5 more 9.?
- There were only 17 perfect Sight-singing scores in all of District 7 (we got 9 of them).
- Hannah Johnson, Elliott Mattox, Katie Sink, and Sarah Tubbesing got perfect 100's (quartet and sight singing combined.)

Schmidt Vocal Competition:

Congratulations to SCAPA Vocal Majors who participated in the Schmidt Vocal Competition sponsored by the University of Kentucky. The Schmidt Youth Vocal Competition was started in 1992 in Indianapolis, Indiana, and then moved to Evansville, Indiana. Recently the Foundation has added an additional site which will be the future home of the William E. Schmidt Youth Vocal Competition. This new site is located in Lexington, Kentucky, at the University of Kentucky. All future competitions around the country will be coordinated from this site.

Each of the four students received recognition for their performances in the competition. In total, Nearly 30 students participated from 3 states.
